



Our support to Richmond Hill's Business community serves three main purposes:

**EDUCATE** – We equip businesses with information and training to help them be successful.

NAVIGATE – We help businesses find pathways through the government and business ecosystem.

**CONNECT** – We create new opportunities for people, businesses and organizations to build partnerships.



# Community Improvement Plan

Richmond Hill's Community Improvement Plan was launched in spring 2018 to incentivize office development and Downtown revitalization. Economic Development provided promotional support through online marketing and in-person visits to businesses, which lead to 49 inquiries by year end.

# Business Ambassador Program



Launched in April 2018, the Business Ambassador Program provided the community with the opportunity to help promote Richmond Hill as the Smart Place for Business.

The program included 44 business ambassadors, which led to 2 large events connecting members of the Latin and Persian communities. From these events, 4 businesses were looking to locate or expand in the City.



The Richmond Hill SBEC interacted with over 1,700 entrepreneurs, business owners, and members of the community in 2018.

- Responded to 1,251 business-related inquiries
- Delivered 39 business seminars throughout the year, including workshops at the Richmond Hill Public Library and the Founder Fundamentals training in collaboration with York University
- SBEC Core Program Highlights:
  - 25 businesses started
  - 25 businesses expanded
  - 17 new Jobs Created
  - Over \$30,000 from other funding sources towards businesses that completed business plan training.

# **Summer** Company

# Starter Company

Working with entrepreneurs as young as 15 years old, the Richmond Hill SBEC provided training, mentorship, and funding to help individuals start or expand their business.

- The Summer Company program delivered approximately 200 hours of training and mentorship to student entrepreneurs and over \$37,000 in total funding, which supported the creation of 13 new businesses
- The Starter Company PLUS program provided training and mentorship to 53 participants aged 18 and older
- \$105,000 supported the creation or expansion of 21 Richmond Hill small businesses



Richmond Hill's RH Concierge program provides business owners, developers, and investors with a priority service to help facilitate the development application process through the convenience of a single point of contact.

 One project was initiated in 2018 for the development of a data centre in the Barker Business Park

## **Corporate Calling Program**

The Corporate Calling Program provides information to Richmond Hill businesses as they grow and scale. Assistance included research support, scale up resources, site selection, partnership development, funding information and navigating government processes.

85 businesses were supported through the program in 2018

Through strong relationships with local businesses, Economic Development helped move growing companies through the complexities of the business ecosystem.

### **Filming in Richmond Hill**

Filming in Richmond Hill has seen an increase in activity since the City took possession of the David Dunlap Observatory. Economic Development promoted the City's unique locations and assisted film location scouts and production companies through the necessary processes.

- In 2018, Richmond Hill hosted 52 days of filming activities generating over \$193,000 in revenues for the City from permit fees and facility rentals

- 153 individuals attended with 26 exhibitors
