Purpose:

The purpose of this staff report is to request the City Manager's approval of a Community Improvement Plan Building Renovation grant application submitted by Atoosa Parsi, the owner of 10156 & 10158 Yonge Street.

Recommendation(s):

- a) That the City Manager approve a Community Improvement Plan Building Renovation grant application to Atoosa Parsi for improvements to 10156 & 10158 Yonge Street in the amount not to exceed \$144,000, as outlined in DA.19.009 and pending the issuance of the necessary permits from the Building Division and applicable Sign Permit.
- b) That the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to sign the grant agreement noted in item (a), upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of Planning and Regulatory Services.
- c) That the Commissioner of Planning and Regulatory Services be authorized to enter into and execute assumption agreements to transfer the grant if property ownership changes.
- d) That the City Manager allow the Director of Financial Services and Treasurer to issue a cheque(s) to disburse the funding to the applicant after it is determined the project has satisfied all requirements.

Background:

The Building Renovation and the Façade, Landscape, and Signage grant program was established in 2018 through the Richmond Hill Office Development and Downtown Local Centre Community Improvement Plan (CIP). It is designed to promote the adaptive re-use of existing structures for office use in the Downtown Local Centre, Oak Ridges Local Centre, Newkirk Business Park and the Beaver Creek Business Park areas. These grant programs have the potential to leverage significant private sector investment in interior building renovations and improvements, and may help address the costs involved with a range of matters, such as retrofitting space for office uses.

The Building Renovation grant is provided on a matching funds basis (up to 50%) to eligible property owners who propose to convert existing commercial and/or industrial and/or residential space into office space, renovate existing or new office space with accessibility improvements in accordance with the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, and/or renovate buildings that are on the Town's Inventory of Architectural and Historical Significance for any non-residential use.

The Façade, Landscape, and Signage grant provides matching grants (up to 50%) to eligible property owners for building façades, front, rear or side lot landscaping (i.e. publicly accessible parts of private properties), exterior signage improvements or any combination of these three categories of property enhancement. The grant amounts range from \$1,000 up to \$25,000 per property depending on the grant and how many frontages or façades are applicable.

On July 9, 2018, Council approved additional funding for certain CIP grant programs resulting from the Ontario Main Street Revitalization Initiative. The Initiative is to help municipal governments undertake main street revitalization initiatives that support and benefit small businesses. This additional funding is to be combined with the existing CIP funding and therefore the program changed from a matching (50%) funding to a cost-shared (90%) funding for the duration of the enhanced program. This changes the Building Renovation grant maximum to \$90,000 per property and a minimum of \$20,000 per property. It also changes the Façade, Landscape, and Signage grant to \$45,000 per property and a minimum of \$2,000 per property. Once the enhanced funding is fully allocated, the grant program will revert back to the previous matching funding model of up to 50% of eligible projects. The enhanced funding program for the Building Renovation grant is available for projects located within the Downtown Local Centre.

To be considered for the program, an owner or applicant authorized by the owner must submit an application form and supporting documents including a detailed description of the proposed improvements, relevant drawings such as floor plans, quotes for the proposed work, and a construction schedule, if known.

This report recommends that Council provide the owner of 10156 & 10158 Yonge Street, Atoosa Parsi, with funding under the Building Renovation and Façade, Landscape, and Signage grant program to assist with the overall cost of these improvements.

Project Details

Atoosa Parsi, owner of 10156 & 10158 Yonge Street made an application for funds under the Building Renovation grant program and the Façade, Landscape, and Signage grant program on April 17, 2019. The structure on the property is currently zoned for General Commercial (GC) and is a vacant single storey structure. This zoning will permit the proposed use as outlined below.

The project is an adaptive reuse of an existing building that proposes complete interior demolition and reconstruction of approximately 2,250 square feet of new dental office at 10156 Yonge Street. As part of the work, the applicant is proposing to make extensive improvements to the façade and to have new signage (see attached Appendix A). Consequently, the applicant is requesting funding from two separate grant categories and three separate types of grants. The requested grants are: façade improvement and signage improvement within the Façade, Landscape, and Signage Grant, as well as the the Building Renovation grant. The new dental office will be a modern, beautiful and attractive family dental practice.

Staff has reviewed the application in relation to the goals, objectives and public benefits as described in the CIP. The review identified that the proposed building renovation will align with the principles identified in the CIP by contributing to:

- the development of office and/or employment land intensification through the appropriate adaptive reuse of existing structures for office in the Downtown Local Centre.
- office attraction, retention and development by providing more opportunities for local employment in a manner which supports intensification and a live/work balance in designated Centres and Corridors along Yonge Street including the Downtown Local Centre.

Overall, the proposed work will increase office space within the Downtown and it meets the goals, objectives, and public benefits of the CIP.

Eligible Costs

In accordance with the CIP, two quotes are submitted for each grant type being considered. The applicant submitted two quotes for building renovations amounting to \$489,380 and \$603,533 (see attached Appendix B). The applicant has submitted two quotes for façade improvements for \$108,480 and \$131,080 (see attached Appendix B), and two quotes for signage improvements for \$22,374 and \$28,781 (see attached Appendix B). Please note that the quotes were adjusted to include HST. The improvements identified in this application proposes structural changes to the existing building and require building and sign permits prior to implementation. The applicant has commenced the building permit process (Building Permit file No. BP#2019-46127) and has yet to proceed with the sign permit process. The grant associated with signage is dependent on the applicant successfully acquiring a sign permit and such conditions will be reflected in the grant agreement.

The following list outlines the list of works to be completed that staff have considered to be eligible costs as per the eligible costs outlined in the CIP:

Building Renovation Grant (see attached Appendix C)

- \$49,790 for total electrical work
- \$18,450 for total HVAC work
- \$67,700 for total wall partitioning and ceiling work
- \$49,250 for total plumbing work
- \$44,780 for total flooring work
- \$9,750 for total interior paint work
- \$20,060 for total installation of supports work
- \$33,310 for total door and window work
- \$90,960 for total millwork
- \$3,430 for total sound system work
- \$6,000 for total service installation work

These eligible costs total \$444,632 (HST included)

Consequently, the following were deemed ineligible costs:

- The CIP evaluation committee in accordance with policy 4.4.2.2 has deemed the
 costs associated with incidentals to the amount of \$21,480 ineligible, as they are
 not fundamentally necessary for the creation of office space.
- Policy 4.4.2.2 Eligible Costs for Building Renovations explicitly states that the
 expansion/additions for office or retrofitting space for office only applies to the
 upper and ground floors of the property. The applicant submitted additional
 building renovation costs as it relates to the basement for \$99,299 (HST
 included). In accordance with policy 4.4.2.2, the basement costs are not covered
 by the CIP grant.

Façade, Signage, and Landscape Grant (Grant for Façade, See attached Appendix C)

- Removal of existing front façade stucco, window, doors, and removal of floor tiles off of the front steps
- Supply and install framing for window changes
- Supply and install new aluminum full glass 8'9"H. double doors for 10156 Yonge Street as shown Appendix C
- Supply and install new aluminum framed double glass window 7'7"Hx 10'7/8"W for 10156 Yonge Street as shown Appendix C
- Supply and install new aluminum full glass single 7'9"H door with upper window above door for address 10158 Yonge Street
- · Supply and install wood cladding
- Supply and install stone texture Stucco as shown on Appendix C
- Supply and install grey zink cladding on front façade and overhang as shown on Appendix C
- Supply and install new non-slip tile on front entrance step and landing

These eligible costs total \$108,480 (HST included)

Façade, Signage, and Landscape Grant (Grant for Signage, See attached Appendix C)

- Supply and install steel and wood bracing from existing parapet and wall to support sign backing
- Supply and install individual LED sign lettering and phone number for the dental office at 10156 Yonge Street
- Supply and install individual lettering for the 10158 Yonge Street
- Supply and install wiring from the electrical panel to timer to sign for two locations

These eligible costs total \$22,374 (HST included)

Recommended Grant Amount

Based on the review and evaluation of the proposed project including the total eligible costs amount and the quotes, staff are recommending that the applicant receive the maximum matching funds from the building renovation grant (\$90,000), the façade improvement grant (\$45,000) and for the signage grant for two properties (\$9,000). The

sum of all grants equates to a total grant request of \$144,000 subject to the terms and conditions in the future grant agreement to be prepared by City staff. The total project value being funded by private investment is \$674,478 representing a private to public investment ratio of approximately 4.5:1. If approved, and after it has been determined that the project has been completed and has passed an inspection, the grant funds will be disbursed.

Time Period to Complete Project

The enhanced grant amount commitment will lapse if the project has not been completed by March 31, 2020. As per the CIP, if a building permit is required, the construction will be required to commence within 6 months of an approved building permit and be fully completed within 18 months. Council may at its discretion adjust these requirements based on the particular circumstances of the construction project which may necessitate approvals from other agencies and/or delays in construction which are not in the control of the applicant to overcome.

Financial/Staffing/Other Implications:

There are sufficient funds available in the CIP Grant program to award this grant. There are no other financial or staffing implications.

Relationship to the Strategic Plan:

The Building Renovation grant program implements the direction in the Strategic Plan to achieve better choice in Richmond Hill, specifically by providing better options for working and doing business as it supports and facilitates new office development along Yonge Street and in older employment areas and encourages and attracts more jobs in the employment corridor with new office space.

Conclusion

Staff have reviewed the proposed grant application and recommends that Council approve a grant in the amount of \$144,000 for the renovations to 10156 & 10158 Yonge Street.

BACKGROUND:

- Pursuant to Part IV of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13, on February 26, 2018, Council of the Town adopted a community improvement plan known as "The Richmond Hill Office Development and Downtown Local Centre Community Improvement Plan" (the "CIP").
- 2. For the purpose of carrying out the CIP, the Town has established grant programs pursuant to which property owners and tenants of lands and buildings within the CIP area may apply for grants to use towards the eligible costs of new development and redevelopment in the CIP area (each a "Grant Program")
- The Recipient has applied to the Town to receive grant monies pursuant to the Grant Program(s) to assist the Recipient in funding the Project approved by Council of the Town as detailed in the Special Provisions below.

SCHEDULE "A" - STANDARD GRANT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. DEFINITIONS, INTERPRETATION AND GENERAL PROVISIONS
- 1.1 Definitions: In this Agreement the following terms will have the following meanings:
- (a) "Agreement" means this agreement, all of the schedules listed in Section 1.5 (Entire Agreement), and any amending agreement entered into pursuant to section 1.4 (Amendments);
- "Authority" or "Authorities" means any government authority, agency, body or department, whether federal, provincial or municipal, having or claiming jurisdiction over the Agreement and/or the Project;
- (c) "Building Code Act" means Ontario Building Code Act, 1992, S.O. 1992, c.23, as amended or superseded;
- (d) "Building Renovation Grant Program" means the grant program described in Section 4.4 of the CIP and pages 43 to 44 of Appendix A – Schedule of Program Details of the CIP;
- (e) "CBO" means the individual appointed from time to time as the Chief Building Official for the Town pursuant to Section 3(2) of the Building Code Act;
- (f) "CIP" means the community improvement plan by Council of the Town Pursuant to Part IV of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13, on February 26, 2018 known as "The Richmond Hill Office Development and Downtown Local Centre Community Improvement Plan":
- (g) "Eligible Costs" means, with respect to the Tax Increment Equivalent Grant, the costs described as eligible in Section 4.3.2 of the CIP, with respect to the Building Renovation Grant, the costs described as eligible in Section 4.4.2 of the CIP and with respect to the Façade Improvement, Landscape & Signage Grant, the costs described as eligible in Section 4.5.2 of the CIP;
- (h) "Event of Default" has the meaning ascribed to in subsection 6.1;
- Façade Improvement, Landscape & Signage Grant" means the grant program described in Section 4.5 of the CIP and pages 45 to 47 of Appendix A – Schedule of Program Details of the CIP;
- "Final Completion" means the completion of the Project in its entirety, including all final payments having been made and holdbacks released;
- (k) "Grant" or "Grant(s)" means the money the Town has agreed to provide to the Recipient pursuant to the terms of this Agreement to assist in funding the Project;
- "Grant Program" means a grant program provided for in the CIP, including the Tax Increment Equivalent Grant and the Building Renovation Grant;
- (m) "Parties" mean all the parties listed in the introductory clause of this Agreement has and "Party" has a corresponding meaning and shall refer to any one of the Parties, as the case be;
- (n) "Project" means the works proposed by the Applicant to be installed on the Subject Property as shown in Schedule "B".
- (o) "Recipient" means the person that has been approved for a Grant;
- (p) "Requirements of Law" means all applicable requirements, laws, statutes, codes, acts, ordinances, approvals, orders, decrees, injunctions, by-laws, rules, regulations, official plans, permits, licences, authorizations, directions, and agreements with all Authorities.
- (q) "Special Provisions" means those additional term applicable to the specific Grant Program under which the Grant has been approved, as set out in the table on the first page of this Agreement;
- (r) "Subject Property" means the lands described in Schedule "A";
- (s) "Tax Increment Equivalent Grant Program" means the grant program described in Section 4.3 of the CIP and pages 40 to 42 of Appendix A – Schedule of Program Details of the CIP;
- (t) "Town" means the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill; and
- (u) "Treasurer" means the individual appointed from time to time as the Treasurer for the Town pursuant to Section 286(1) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25.
- 1.2 General Interpretation: (a) Words in the singular include the plural and vice-versa; words in one gender include all genders; (b) the

- background and the headings do not form part of the Agreement; they are for reference only and will not affect the interpretation of the Agreement; (c) any reference to dollars or currency will be in Canadian dollars and currency; and (d) every obligation of the Recipient under this Agreement shall be deemed to include "at the expense of the Recipient", unless specifically stated otherwise.
- 1.3 Recitals: The recitals to this Agreement form an integral part of this Agreement.
- 1.4 Amendments: The Agreement may only be amended by a written agreement.
- .5 Entire Agreement: This agreement, including: the Special Provisions; Schedule "A" Project Description; and this Schedule "B" Standard Grant Terms and Conditions; constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter contained in the Agreement and supersedes all prior oral or written representations and agreements.
- 6 Conflict or Inconsistency. In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between any of the requirements of the Special Provisions and any requirements of a schedule: (a) Schedule "B" Project Description will prevail over the Special Provisions and Schedule "A" Standard Grant Terms and Conditions and (b) the Special Provisions of the Agreement will prevail over Schedule "A" Standard Grant Terms and Conditions.
- REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES, COVENANTS AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS
- 2.1 General Representations. The Recipient represents, warrants and covenants that: (a) it is, and will continue to be, a validly existing legal entity with full power to fulfill its obligations under the Agreement; (b) it has, and will continue to have, the experience and expertise necessary to carry out the Project; (c) unless otherwise provided for in the Agreement, any information the Recipient provided to the Town in support of its request for the Grant including, without limitation, information relating to any eligibility requirements and the Project, was true and complete at the time the Recipient provided it and will continue to be true and complete; (d) it is not in default of any term, condition or obligation under any agreement with or order of the Town; and (d) it, the Subject Property and the Project are in compliance with, and will continue to comply with, all Requirements of Law related to any aspect of the Project and the Grant.
- 2.2 Execution of Agreement: The Recipient represents and warrants that it has the full power and authority to enter into the Agreement and taken all necessary actions to authorize the execution of the Agreement.
- 2.3 Acknowledgements: The Recipient acknowledges that: (a) the Grant is to assist the Recipient in carrying out the Project and not to provide goods or services to the Town; (b) the Town is not responsible for carrying out the Project; and (c) the Town is bound by the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.M56, and any information provided to the Town in connection with the Project or otherwise in connection with the Agreement may be subject to disclosure in accordance with that Act
- CARRYING OUT THE PROJECT
- 3.1 Requirements Prior to Submission of an Application for a Building Permit: The Recipient acknowledges that, prior to submitting an application for a building permit for the Project to the CBO it shall have: (i) executed this Agreement; (b) obtained all necessary road occupancy and other permits and approvals required by any Authorities, or made satisfactory arrangements to do so prior to starting construction; (c) submitted the required applications and fees to the Town's Planning and Regulatory Services Department for building permits, inclusive of all information as may be required by the CBO; and; (d) paid to the Town all applicable development and other charges as may be required by the Town or have made an arrangement satisfactory to the Town for payment of same.

- 3.2 Recipient's Responsibility for Project. The Recipient shall have full responsibility for the Project, including, without limitation: (i) complete, diligent and timely implementation of the Project in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Agreement; (b) the entire cost of the Project, including, without limitation, payment of all Eligible Costs; (c) subsequent operation, maintenance, repair, rehabilitation, demolition or reconstruction, as required and as per appropriate standards; and (d) undertaking, or causing to be undertaken, any engineering and construction work in accordance with industry or applicable Town standards, in conformity with the approved scope and in compliance with the Requirements of Law and of any building permit and the Building Code Act and no deviation from or modification of the Project shall be made without the written approval of the Town.
- 3.3 Access and Inspection: Without limiting any of the statutory powers of the CBO or of any inspector appointed for the purpose of enforcing the Building Code Act, the Recipient covenants and agrees that the CBO, and any other designated agent(s) of the Town shall have the right, at all times, to inspect the Subject Property and the Project. If in the opinion of the CBO, or other Town designate, the Project is not being carried out in accordance with the Building Code Act or other Requirements of Law or of this Agreement, the CBO may, in the event of an urgent or emergency situation, immediately issue a stop work order for all or any part of the construction for any length of time until the Project been placed in satisfactory condition.
- Road Occupancy Permits and Related Matters: No construction shall take place on, or cause the obstruction of, any Town lands, including highways, unless the Recipient has obtained the proper road occupancy or other permits and in any event, not prior to sufficient securities having been deposited with the Town. limiting the provisions of any road occupancy or other permit, the Recipient shall at all times keep the Subject Property and the Town's lands and highways in reasonable condition and free from public nuisances such as dust, noise, vibration or noxious odours, all hazardous situations and unnecessary debris and refuse and shall properly secure any hazardous or potentially hazardous site situation that may be necessary during the course of construction of the Project. The Recipient shall not obstruct ingress or egress to the Subject Property or interfere with traffic flowing along adjoining highways and shall provide all necessary signs and lighting to provide ample warning to the public and any area that poses actual or potential dangers and/or hazards. The Recipient shall be responsible for the full costs involved in the relocation of any existing service or utility and shall repair or replace any infrastructure, utilities, existing structure or landscaping located within any highway or other Town lands that have been damaged as a result of the Project.
- 3.5 Waste: The Recipient shall ensure that all refuse and debris associated with the Project are disposed of in an orderly, sanitary and expeditious manner in a disposal area provided by the Recipient. The Town will not be responsible for the removal, disposal or acceptance of refuse and debris.
- 3.6 Construction Lien Act: The Recipient covenants and agrees that it will hold back in its payments to any contractor on the Project such amounts as may be required under the provisions of the Construction Lien Act. The obligation of the Recipient to indemnify the Town will extend to any matters arising under the Construction Lien Act, or any other claim for unpaid accounts. On demand by the Town, the Recipient will take such steps as may be necessary to immediately discharge all liens registered upon the Subject Property.
- 4. GRANT AND TOWN COSTS
- 4.1 Grant provided. Provided the Recipient is not in default of any of its obligations under this Agreement and subject to the conditions precedent below having been met, the Town will provide the Grant to the Recipient in accordance with the Special Provisions.

- 4.2 Conditions Precedent to Payment of Grant(s): The Town shall have no obligation to pay the Grant(s) until the Recipient has: (a) obtained a final inspection of, and (if applicable) an occupancy permit for, the Project by the Town; (b) provided a written request to the Treasurer for the Grant(s), accompanied by an accounting of all Eligible Costs with supporting invoices; (c) demonstrated to the Town that Final Completion has been reached; (d) satisfied the Town that, in achieving Final Completion for the Project, it has completed the Project in accordance with its Application and in compliance with this Agreement and any other applicable agreements or permits; (e) satisfied the Town that any Eligible Costs or other costs relating to the Project have been paid in full and that there are no claims or litigation in respect of the Project or the Subject Property and (f) satisfied any other additional requirements that may be set out in the Special Provisions.
- 4.3 Additional Documentation and Audit. The Town may request any additional documentation or proof of any work claimed to be complete and may request a third party review or audit of any matter. Any third party audit shall be at the cost of the Recipient. Notwithstanding the performance of an audit or the payment of any Grant(s) pursuant to this agreement, the Town shall not be stopped from having such additional audits conducted as it sees fit, in its sole discretion.
- 5. INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION
- 5.1 Insurance: Upon execution of this Agreement, the Recipient shall file with the Town evidence of the Recipients General Liability Insurance coverage in the amount of not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) per occurrence, identifies the Town as an additional insured, and is specifically applicable to the project for which this grant applies. Evidence of Insurance must be provided on a Town Certificate of Insurance form, which is available in PDF fillable format at www.richmondhill.ca/certificatesofinsurance. The insurance coverage shall be primary and shall not call into contribution any insurance coverage of the Town. The Town reserves the right to increase this limit in the event it identifies additional risks that require further coverage. The Recipient shall keep the policy in force until the Project has been completed and approved by the Town, or the Town otherwise advises that the coverage is no longer required.
- 5.2 Indemnification. The Recipient will indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Town, its appointees, employees, agents, contractors and volunteers from and against any and all liability, loss, costs, damages and expenses (including legal, expert and consultant fees), causes of action, actions, claims, demands, lawsuits or other proceedings, by whomever made, sustained, incurred, brought or prosecuted, in any way arising out of or in connection with the Project or otherwise in connection with the Agreement, unless solely caused by the negligence or wilful misconduct of the Town.
- 6. DEFAULT
- Events of Default. Each of the following events will constitute an Event of Default: (a) in the opinion of the Town, the Recipient breaches any representation, warranty, covenant or other material term of the Agreement including, without limitation, failing to do any of the following in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Agreement: (i) obtain a building permit (if applicable) and reaching Final Completion within any timeline specified in the Special Provisions; (ii) complete the Project in accordance with the Application; (iii) make payments to service providers or contractors in connection with the Project; (b) the Recipient or the Project no longer meets one or more of the eligibility requirements of the Grant Program; or (c) the Recipient makes an assignment, proposal, compromise, or arrangement for the benefit of creditors, or a creditor makes an application for an order adjudging the Recipient bankrupt, or applies for the appointment of a receiver.
- 6.2 Consequences of Default: If an Event of Default occurs, the Town may, at any time, take one or more of the following actions: (a) initiate any action the Town considers necessary in order to facilitate the

successful continuation or completion of the Project; (b) provide the Recipient with an opportunity to remedy the Event of Default; (c) suspend the payment of the Grant(s) until such time as the Town determines appropriate; (d) reduce the amount of the Grant(s) and/or cancel further instalments of the Grant(s); (e) demand from the Recipient the payment of any Grant(s) already paid, or an amount equal to any Grant(s) together with interest at a rate to be determined by Council for the Town; (f) add those amounts referred to in (e) to the tax roll to be collected in like manner as municipal taxes; and (g) terminate the Agreement at any time, including immediately, without liability, penalty or costs to the Town upon giving notice to the Recipient of same.

6.3 Opportunity to Remedy: If, in accordance with paragraph 6.2, the Town provides the Recipient with an opportunity to remedy the Event of Default, the Town will provide the Recipient with a written notice including the particulars of the Event of Default and the period of time in which to remedy. In the event that the Recipient does not or cannot remedy the Event of Default within the time set out in the notice or is not proceeding to remedy the Event of Default in a manner that is satisfactory to the Town, the Town may extend the period to remedy or may initiate any one or more of the other actions provided for in subsection 6.2.

6.4 Termination Effective. Termination under this Section 6 will take effect as provided for in any termination notice.

7. GENERAL MATTERS

7.1 Assignment: The Recipient may not assign the whole or part of this Agreement or any monies due under the Grant(s) without prior written consent of the Town. Such consent shall be in the sole discretion of the Town and subject to such terms and conditions that may be imposed by the Town. Without limiting the generality of the conditions which the Town may require prior to consenting to an assignment, every assignment must be documented by an agreement between the Recipient, the person to whom the recipient intends to assign (the "Assignee") and the Town whereby the Recipient and Assignee agree that the Assignee will be bound by all the terms and conditions of this Agreement and assume all of rights, liabilities and obligations the Recipient in the Agreement.

7.3 Extension of Time: Time shall always be of the essence in fulfilling the terms of this Agreement. Any time limit specified in this Agreement may be extended with the consent in writing of all the Parties, but no such extension of time shall operate or be deemed to operate as an extension of any other time limit, and time shall be deemed to remain of the essence of this Agreement notwithstanding any extension of any time limit.

7.4 Waivers: Either Party may, by providing notice in accordance with subsection 7.2, as the other Party to waive an obligation under the Agreement. Any waiver granted in response to such request will; be valid only if the Party granting the waiver provides it in writing; and apply only to the specific obligation referred to in the waiver.

7.5 Invalidity or Unenforceability of Any Provision. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of the Agreement will not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of the Agreement. Any invalid or unenforceable provision will be deemed to be severed.

- 7.9 Rights and Remedies Cumulative. The rights and remedies of the Province under the Agreement are cumulative and are in addition to, and not in substitution for, any of its rights and remedies provided by law or in equity.

PERMITS/HEAT LOSS CALCULATIONS & INSURANCE

Precision Dental Construction/701638 Ontario limited, shall create the drawings for the architect to apply for permit. These drawings represent the proposed interior ground and basement Electrical Receptacle Reflective Ceiling, Fire Safety, Plumbing for Sanitary Drains, hot and cold water, vacuum and air lines. These drawings shall be reviewed and approved by an engineer ready for submission for a Building Permit and then sent to the Architect for submission to the city of Richmond Hill for the building permit. The X ray approval drawing have not be produced or submitted at this point and are not included at this point as part of Precision Dental Construction/701638 Ontario limited responsibility. 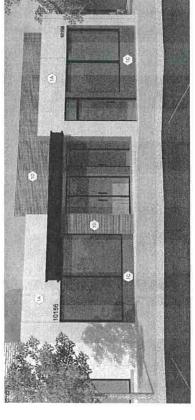








PROPOSED MAIN ELEVATION RENDER 1
