Strategic Priorities 2020-2022

To support good decision making and effective administration, especially in light of the current and anticipated financial pressures the COVID-19 pandemic, the City undertook a strategic planning exercise in mid-2020 to understand Council and community priorities for the organization in the immediate term.

To that end, a consultant was hired to interview Councillors to understand their priorities for the community, complete a survey of the community and facilitate a discussion at a Special Council meeting toward the synthesis of priorities with which to move forward.

This document includes the four Strategic Priority Areas identified in this process.

As the priorities areas that emerged were reflected in a number of current and planned projects, programs and initiatives of the organization, these are identified under each area to demonstrate how the City's work aligns with the four Strategic Priority Areas to the end of 2022.

Progress on these Priorities, and the work related to each, will be tracked by the City Manager's Office.
