Subject: Proposed Four High Rises Major Mackenzie and Yonge Street.

My husband and I are writing to voice our objections to the proposed development:

Who: The Acorn Development Corporation, Acorn Major Mack Inc. and Woodcreek Development Corporation

Where: 190, 210 and 230 Major MacKenzie Drive West and 129, 133, 137, 141, 143 and 147 Arnold Crescent

What: The applications seek to permit a high-density residential development comprised of four apartment buildings ranging in height from 10 to 19 storeys with at-grade townhouse dwelling units, and a total of 790 residential units on the subject lands.

Richmond Hill is far too dense as it is. 800 units means at least twice if not four times as many people, cars and stress on the infrastructure. That part of Yonge Street still permits parking which forces traffic into one lane. We have a level railroad crossing on Elgin Mills which holds up traffic from Yonge Street to Bayview every day. Someone(s) wants to make a lot of money. That's all it's about. We cannot see any positive side to bringing more highrises; people and traffic to 'downtown' Richmond Hill.
