Hi Godwin,

This email is in response to the notice that you sent out on April 16<sup>th</sup>. I have very serious concerns about the proposed development on Oneida and would like to know how I would go about arguing against the project? My concern is a safety issue. The corner of High Tech/Red Maple continues to be a hotspot for car accidents especially with the GO station and the Tim Hortons located in a spot where many are making a left onto Red Maple with out a light.

In addition, there is horrible control regarding traffic on Oneida itself. Currently, there are cars parked in the center area (where the proposed development it). This blocks the view of oncoming traffic for those driving or approaching the bend. And because of the amount of folks parking on the street, cars that are turning the bend are doing so onto the wrong side of the road. I watch this from my window on a daily basis. The street parking due to the lack of parking in the buildings itself and the failure to properly maintain the road has caused the street to allow one car one way at a time in most spots

With the added condos already built, there has been a significant increase in traffic with no solution into how to handle that traffic and the complications due to the extra population.

Before adding more buildings into an already highly populated area with existing safety concerns, these issues need to be addressed and solutions need to be implemented.
