The Richmond Hill Naturalists, the DDO Defenders and the Observatory Hill Homeowners Association together met with the Federal government Ministers Prentice and Kent, along with Parks Canada in 2009. As you are aware the Conservation Review Board delivered its report on the David Dunlap Observatory earlier this spring. It is anticipated that Town staff will be presenting a report to Richmond Hill Council early in the fall that will respond to the Board's recommendations. During the course of the hearing before the Board, your client assembled and tendered a large collection of materials pertaining to the historic development and use of the David Dunlap Observatory site over a period dating back to the establishment of the original farming homesteads. The utility of this material to the Board's deliberations was acknowledged at page 50 of their report, where the panel made the following statement:

"The Board must commend the Naturalists for their extensive undertaking to document the history and physical presence of this property. Dr. Wilhelm Bleck, 136 Centre Street West, addressed Council regarding The David Dunlap Observatory Lands Conservation Management and Planning Study Report advising that he sees value in the planning and design principles presented in the Report and highlighted which principles, in his opinion, are important. He clarified that he did not prefer any of the three proposed design scenarios within the Report and requested that Council remove the information pertaining to the design scenarios from the Report before receiving it. He stressed that a balance is required between public interest and private ownership, and between the historical and cultural heritage and future development.

Marianne Yake, Richmond Hill Naturalists, addressed Council regarding The David Dunlap Observatory Lands Conservation Management and Planning Study Report. She advised that they would like to see the entire property protected; advised of concerns with the Report specifically with the planning and design principles in terms of how they were developed; and advised of their concerns with the cultural heritage assessment completed on the Panhandle lands. She requested that the Report not be received by Council until a response is received back from the Federal and Provincial Governments on this matter. She also raised the question of the use of information contained in materials asserted to be the property of the Richmond Hill Naturalists without express permission. The Chief Administrative Officer for the Town of Richmond Hill responded.

Renu Duggal, 332 Fern Avenue, President of the Observatory Hills Homeowners Association, addressed Council regarding The David Dunlap Observatory Lands Conservation Management and Planning Study Report advising that they do not want to see any development on the property. She also advised of their concerns with the cultural heritage assessment completed on the Panhandle lands. She requested that the Report not be received by Council but rather that Council endorse the motion being forwarded to the Federal and Provincial Governments on this matter.

Karen Cilevitz, 40 Birch Avenue, addressed Council regarding The David Dunlap Observatory Lands Conservation Management and Planning Study Report advising of her concerns with the Report and the impact of the planning and design principles on the Official Plan. She inquired why the Report does not include comments from the owner of the property, as a stakeholder. She further advised of her concerns with the cultural heritage assessment completed on the Panhandle lands.

Marion Matthias, Ward One (South) Thornhill Residents Inc., addressed Council regarding The David Dunlap Observatory Lands Conservation Management and Planning Study Report advising of their concerns with the Town of Markham not being consulted as a stakeholder for their input into the Report. She further advised that they would like to see the entire property protected so that all residents can enjoy the space.

iii) David Dunlap Observatory Lands

J. Shaykewick referred to a proposed plan put forward by the owners of the David Dunlap Observatory lands and enquired why the submission was determined to be incomplete. Councillor Foster advised that no plans had been circulated to Council and therefore she was not aware of what was missing.

Mr. Shaykewick discussed with Committee his concerns relating to the handling of intellectual property as it relates to the materials prepared by the Richmond Hill Naturalists. He suggested that perhaps the Committee could formally express its concerns regarding how this was addressed.

Committee acknowledged the work and contributions of the Richmond Hill Naturalists. Comments brought forward included whether this was something that could be dealt with by Committee, whether there were rules and regulations governing this type of issue, and whether permission should have been received by the Town.

iv) Charlie Barker House, 10251 Leslie Street

J. Horner requested that plaques be provided for the Charlie Barker House and barns located at 10251 Leslie Street.

v) Status Update - Eyer Wideman House, 1045 Elgin Mills Road East

J. Horner advised of the Grand Opening of the Eyer Wideman House (formally known as the Eyer Homestead) and requested that a new plague be provided for the property in recognition of the Wideman family. Staff advised that a new plaque will be ordered and that as part of changing the property name to the Eyer Wideman House, the by-law enacted for this property will need to be amended.
