11. Presentations

11.1 Presentation regarding Community Energy and Emissions Plan: Richmond Hill's Path to a Low Carbon Future - (refer to Item 13.9)

• Maria Flores, Manager of Sustainability;

Maria Flores, Manager of Sustainability, began the presentation by advising that the Community Energy and Emissions Plan (CEEP) was the result of Council's commitment to improve resiliency in Richmond Hill through climate change mitigation and adaptation. She noted that the plan helps the City meet its legislative obligations, demonstrates municipal leadership in climate action, opens the door to future funding and partnership opportunities, and provides a path to work with the community, other levels of government and stakeholders to become a low carbon community. M. Flores thanked members of the public, stakeholders and staff who participated in the advisory committee and engagement events, and acknowledged their funding partners. She also acknowledged Julius Lindsay, Project Manager of Climate Change and their consultants for leading development of the CEEP.

Terry Sidhu, Sustainability Solutions Group, provided an overview of the climate challenge that Canada and the globe are facing, shared the purpose statement that will guide their planning, and noted that the goal of the CEEP was to reach net-zero GHG emissions by 2050. He advised of other jurisdictions across Canada and within Ontario that have a net-zero target, and outlined how the CEEP was structured. T. Sidhu provided an illustration to show that 70 percent of the City's low carbon action needed to focus on decarbonizing transportation and building stock within the community. He also outlined seven critical targets that can decrease community emissions by 65 percent by 2050.

Julius Lindsay, Project Manager of Climate Change, advised of additional investments required under the Net-Zero Scenario, the net benefits that are expected, and highlighted that the average Richmond Hill household could save approximately 50 percent on energy costs by 2050 if the CEEP was completed. J. Lindsay shared details on the implementation plan and provided examples of 5-year priorities to kick-start climate action. He noted that as part of the CEEP a Climate Change Toolkit was developed for residents of Richmond Hill as a guide to talking to others about climate change. J. Lindsay concluded by sharing the vision from the plan of what Richmond Hill will look like in 2050.
