Subject: Apartment buildings Leslie Street and Elgin Mill Road

It is with great alarm that I read about the 27 and 31 storey apartment building plan at this location.

I am a long time resident of Richmond Hill and this is in my immediate neighbourhood.

This is a quiet residential neighbourhood that has recently seen the development of monster data centres (six of them) east of Leslie - with 90 feet hydro poles springing up all along the West side (residential side) without any prior warning to the residents. Then, the sudden proposal of a painted mural 120 feet wide marking the entrance to the data centre.

And now high density residences are proposed to further destroy our quiet area. Not to mention the lowering of our house values. There seems to be no consultation with the residents prior to all this destructive planning. In my opinion, all high density residential buildings should be located along the Yonge Street corridor, where public transport and shopping are more convenient for future residents.

I am totally opposed to this proposal and hope logic will prevail (soon).
