### 4. Scheduled Business

4.1 SRPI.21.061 - Richmond Hill David Dunlap Observatory Park Early Priorities Project Update

- Presentation by Bob Levesque, Director, Infrastructure Delivery, and Mike McCallum, Project Manager, Infrastructure Delivery

Paolo Masaro, Executive Director, Infrastructure and Engineering Services, provided introductory remarks and acknowledged the work of the Capital Sustainability Steering Committee (CSSC) and the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Richmond Hill David Dunlap Observatory (RHDDO) Park Project. He highlighted the work that has been done since the last meeting of the David Dunlap Observatory Park Project Steering Committee (DDOPPSC) in April 2019, and introduced Bob Levesque, Director, Infrastructure Delivery, and Mike McCallum, Project Manager, Infrastructure Delivery, who would be providing a detailed presentation to the Committee.

Bob Levesque, Director, Infrastructure Delivery, reviewed the composition of the RHDDO Park Project Steering Committee, the staff Steering Committee, and the Technical Steering Committee, and displayed an aerial view of the RHDDO to provide context to the site. He provided an overview of the Master Plan that was approved in September 2016 which included a Vision Statement, Early Priorities (1 to 8 years - extended), Medium-term Projects (8 to 15 years), and Long-term Projects (15+ years); reviewed the Early Priorities Phasing Design and Early Priorities Phasing Construction; and detailed the 2022 Draft Capital Budget and Forecast.

Kathleen Graver, Manager, Strategic Communications, provided an overview of the Communications Approach for the RHDDO Park including goals and strategies, and reviewed Communications Tactics that included developing templates for use by all project partners with RHDDO branding, updating the RichmondHill.ca/DDO landing and child pages, and making use of existing communication channels as appropriate for major initiatives and year-end success wrap-up.

Mike McCallum, Project Manager, Infrastructure Delivery, discussed Current Projects and Activities including Interim Trails, Elvis Stojko Arena Fencing, Woodlot Restoration, and Heritage Building Restoration.

B. Levesque concluded the presentation by reviewing the recommendations related to the Radio Shack as a result of the 2017

Building Assessment Report and the recommendations related to the Pump House as detailed in the Master Plan, reviewed next steps in the process for the Committee, and opened up discussion to the Committee members if they had any questions and/or comments.

General discussion ensued regarding the budget associated with the RHDDO Park Project and the impact on the tax rate, as well as concerns with the timing and costs specific to the demolition and replication of the Radio Shack. Background information was provided to members regarding the purpose of both the DDOPPSC and the CSSC, noting that the DDOPPSC paused its work to allow for the CSSC to complete its mandate which was to inform and educate on fiscal sustainability and establish a sustainable long term capital investment strategy, and it was through that process that a strategy was developed where the DDO property and its historic buildings were identified as a priority.

Committee members discussed the budget and timing of the Pedestrian Rail Overpass as an Early Priority Feature of the Project as pedestrian access was key in establishing the DDO Park as a passive park; funding sources for the Project; integrating the trail system with other parks; initiation of a Parking Study to identify parking options on the site, taking into consideration interim and long term solutions, and potential for a shuttle bus service; programming for the DDO Park and property; redesign of the 16th Avenue entrance and signage/wayfinding for the site; fencing around the Elvis Stojko Arena; and the overall positive impact of the DDO Park on local tourism.

That the David Dunlap Observatory Park Project Steering Committee recommends to Council:

- a) That staff report SRPI.21.061 regarding the Richmond Hill David
  Dunlap Observatory Park Early Priorities Project Update be received;
- b) That the David Dunlap Observatory Park Project Steering Committee recommend continued support of the David Dunlap Observatory Project;
- c) That the 10 Year Capital forecast include the early priorities identified in staff report SREIS.19.007 with an extended timeframe for implementation following the outcome of the Capital Sustainability Steering Committee review;

d) That staff continue with the implementation of the early priorities as well as the woodlot restoration work approved through the Corsica development agreement.
