We heard that three new buildings will be erect on the east side location of my town house. I noticed from these pictures in my mailbox, they will be too close to our house we living. I found that there are three new retirement buildings and long term care facilities on 11300 Yonge Street.

The reasons for our objective are as follows:

1. The new buildings to be build are too close and high, once buildings are completed, we will lose our privacy completely.
2. The new buildings will block our sunlight and fresh air and due to that we will lose our east side view permanently as well.
