1. Call to Order/National Anthem

The Mayor called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

2. Public Forum (not to exceed 15 minutes)

Yoke Wong, Richmond Hill resident and member of the Council Compensation Review Committee (CCRC), addressed Council regarding the recommendations that were approved at the June 8, 2022 Council meeting specific to the Severance By-law, expressing her concerns that the recommendation of the CCRC to repeal and replace the Member of Council Severance Remuneration By-law wasn't approved.

3. Council Announcements

Councillor Muench wished everyone a happy first day of summer, and extended congratulations to Councillor Liu on the success of his Ward 3 barbeque last week, noting that Councillor Liu has now set the bar for other Members of Council to host an event as well.

Councillor Muench expressed his concerns with the news that came out earlier today regarding the inflation rate, and noted that it needed to be taken into consideration during expense and budget deliberations.

Councillor Sheppard acknowledged that yesterday was National Indigenous Peoples Day, and recognized the diverse culture and contributions of the Indigenous community.

Councillor Liu extended his appreciation to all of the staff who helped and contributed to the success of the Ward 3 barbeque held last week, and thanked all of the residents who came out.

Councillor Chan also wished everyone a happy summer and acknowledged that yesterday was National Indigenous Peoples Day.

Councillor Chan, as Chair of the Economic Development Committee, advised that he along with Mayor West and York Region Chair Emmerson attended the Collision Conference in Toronto that included the formal launch of Richmond Hill's Centre for Local Innovation and Collaboration (CLIC), a partnership with OCAD University and eCampusOntario, and extended congratulations to staff in Economic Development for their work.

Regional and Local Councillor DiPaola extended congratulations to the Richmond Hill Board of Trade on the success of their annual golf tournament held on June 21st at Eagle's Nest Golf Club, noting that he along with Councillor Sheppard were in attendance to bring greetings on behalf of Richmond Hill Council.

Mayor West reiterated the comments made by Councillor Chan regarding their attendance at the Collision Conference and the announcement regarding Richmond Hill's Centre for Local Innovation and Collaboration (CLIC), highlighting the partnership between the City, OCAD University and eCampusOntario and the benefits and opportunities for businesses.

11. Presentations

11.1 Presentation by Gigi Li, Director, Financial Services and Treasurer, and Gary Scandlan, Watson & Associates, regarding the Community Benefits Charge Strategy - (refer to Item 13.4)

Gigi Li, Director, Financial Services and Treasurer, provided introductory remarks and advised that the she along with Gary Scandlon, Watson & Associates Economists Ltd., were in attendance to present to Council an update on the City's Community Benefits Charge (CBC) Strategy and Bylaw. She noted the legislative changes that impacted the way municipalities were able to generate funds from development, provided an overview of the consultation that has taken place to date regarding the CBC Strategy and draft By-law, and advised that staff would be reporting back at the next Council meeting.

Gary Scandlon, Watson & Associates Economists Ltd., made a presentation to Council regarding the City of Richmond Hill's 2022 Community Benefits Charge (CBC). He provided a brief overview of the Study process and timelines; highlighted the methodology used for the CBC Strategy; and reviewed growth forecast and land valuation, cost allocations, capital costs and calculated CBC rate, and exemptions. G. Scandlon concluded the presentation by discussing the Study process and next steps which included consideration of the draft By-law at the July 6, 2022 Council meeting.

12.1 Adam Layton, Evans Planning, regarding the Community Benefits Charge Strategy - (refer to Item 13.4)

Adam Layton, Evans Planning, on behalf of Yonge Ridge Developments Inc., owners of 13351 and 13359 Yonge Street, addressed Council

regarding the Community Benefits Charge (CBC) Strategy and By-law. He provided a brief overview of the development proposal of 50 back-to-back stacked townhouse dwelling units on the subject lands that were approved in principle by Council, and addressed access to the underground parking structure and upper units that would have exclusive rooftop terraces accessed by a small 'pop-up' structure. A. Layton, after reviewing the CBC By-law, requested that the definitions of "Grade" and "Storey" be reviewed in the context of the subject properties as further detailed in his correspondence distributed as Item 13.9.

Debbie George, 1286302 Ontario Limited, on behalf of the Shirley Laneway Committee, addressed Council regarding the Response to Council Motion: Report on Assumption of the Private Laneway for Freehold Townhouses 141-247 Shirley Drive. She provided a brief history of when this matter was first brought before Council, and requested that consideration of the options for the assumption of the private laneway servicing the freehold townhomes municipally known as 141-247 Shirley Drive be deferred to a future meeting to allow the Shirley Laneway Committee sufficient time to review and research the options proposed in staff report SRPI.22.034.

Jay Shea, Indigenous Action Committee (IAC), addressed Council regarding the Member Motion submitted by Regional and Local Councillor Perrelli regarding a Land Acknowledgement. He extended his thanks to Council and staff for their work and the support they have shown the IAC and Indigenous community, and highlighted the many events they have been a part of to help raise awareness including the Indigenous Peoples Celebration being held on Saturday at the Elgin Barrow Arena. J. Shea addressed the challenges being faced within Richmond Hill to adopt a Land Acknowledgment and explained why they brought forward suggested wording for a Land Acknowledgement through Regional and Local Councillor Perrelli which he hoped would be passed at today's Council meeting.

Whereas a stand-alone land acknowledgment without meaningful action is not the ideal situation; and

Whereas the Truth and Reconciliation Call to Action #57 states:

We call upon federal, provincial, territorial, and municipal governments to provide education to public servants on the history of Aboriginal peoples, including the history and legacy of residential schools, the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, Treaties and Aboriginal rights, Indigenous law, and Aboriginal—Crown relations. This will require skills-based training in intercultural competency, conflict resolution, human rights, and antiracism; and

Whereas the City of Richmond Hill created a course, The PATH - Your Journey through Indigenous Canada, available for employees of Richmond Hill through Richmond Hill University to provide education and training on the history of Aboriginal peoples; and

Whereas through the above action, the City of Richmond Hill has taken concrete action to implement call to action #57, one of the few calls to action that provide a specific direction to municipal governments; and

Whereas a Land Acknowledgement would reinforce the aforementioned action in a strong show of support to our Indigenous community; and Whereas the Indigenous Action Committee of Richmond Hill developed a Land Acknowledgement which embodies the goals and wishes of the Richmond Hill Indigenous Community;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved:

That the following Land Acknowledgement be added to the opening of all future Richmond Hill Council Meetings:

The land that we meet on today is the traditional territory of the Anishinaabe, the Haudenosaunee, the Huron Wendat, and is currently home to many diverse and displaced First Nations, Inuit and Metis people.

We would like to recognize, acknowledge and thank the people of the Chippewas of Georgina Island First Nation, the Chippewas of Rama First Nation, Beausoleil First Nation, the Mississaugas of Scugog Island, the Mississaugas of the Credit and many others who have cared for the land for thousands of years before us.

We are committed to ongoing learning, and we strive to move forward with good hearts and minds and are committed to doing so with gratitude and respect for the past, present and future caretakers of this land.
