# 2. Land Acknowledgement

We are gathering on lands that have been home to First Nations Peoples from time immemorial. We acknowledge that what we now call Richmond Hill is on the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the Mississauga and Chippewa Nations of the Williams Treaty. We also recognize that we are on part of the traditional territories of the Haudenosaunee and the Huron Wendat.

We would also like to acknowledge all First Nation, Inuit and Métis peoples from across North America, also known as Turtle Island, who now reside in the City of Richmond Hill. We are committed to rebuilding constructive and cooperative relationships.

## 4. Public Forum (not to exceed 15 minutes)

# 4.1 Yoke Wong, on behalf of the Richmond Hill Road Watch Committee, regarding Canada Road Safety Week (May 16 to 22, 2023); Road Watch Program; and the Richmond Hill Road Watch Committee

Yoke Wong, on behalf of the Richmond Hill Road Watch Committee, addressed Council regarding Canada Road Safety Week being held May 16 to 22, 2023; the history of the Road Watch Program; and highlighted the Richmond Hill Road Watch Committee purpose, mandate and 2023 initiatives and community events. Y. Wong requested that residents, Council, staff, partners and stakeholders participate, help raise awareness, and be part of the committee's journey and success.

# 4.2 John Li, 206 Brookside Road, regarding Lessons Learned from Past Restrictions on Resident Engagement in Municipal Affairs

John Li, 206 Brookside Road, addressed Council regarding lessons learned from past restrictions on resident engagement in municipal affairs, noting that in his opinion, a five minute speaking time was insufficient to address Council on complex planning matters. He also remarked on planning matters in Richmond Hill.

## 5. Council Announcements

Regional and Local Councillor Chan extended appreciation to the Richmond Hill Road Watch Committee for the Public Forum presentation, and acknowledged that the program was supported by the City and York Region Police and was a long-running program in the community. He asked that the community work together to continue to promote public safety and to drive responsibly.

Regional and Local Councillor Chan advised that he together with Mayor West, Councillor Cui, and Councillor Davidson participated in the Hike for Hospice on Sunday, May 7<sup>th</sup> and noted the success of the fundraising event.

Councillor Cui extended thanks to the Road Watch Committee for the presentation and requested a copy of the material so that he could share it with schools in Ward 4 to promote the program and road safety.

Mayor West announced that today McDonald's was hosting McHappy Day, an annual day of community giving to support Ronald McDonald House charities and other local children's charities. He advised that he was volunteering at the 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue drive thru at 3 p.m. and encouraged everyone to support the worthy cause.

Mayor West advised of the Multiple Sclerosis (MS) flag raising event that was being held at the main municipal offices on May 17<sup>th</sup> at 3 p.m. and extended an invitation to the community to attend and support the MS Society at the event.

Mayor West advised that Sunday, May 14<sup>th</sup> was a celebration for mothers and extended a Happy Mother's Day to all mothers in the community.

Councillor Cui advised of the Strides for Mackenzie Health fundraising event that was taking place on May 13<sup>th</sup> and encouraged all to donate and support the worthy cause.

# 14.1 Howard Doughty, 10 Cheval Court, regarding the Richmond Hill Centre Secondary Plan (Official Plan Amendment 41) and Proposed By-law 55-23 - (refer to Items 15.1.8 and 18.5)

Howard Doughty, 10 Cheval Court, shared his beliefs that the Richmond Hill Centre Secondary Plan project would be one of the most densely populated areas in the planet and that it was insufficiently supported by current and planned infrastructure. H. Doughty stated that development implied a natural evolution and that what was proposed was not a development but degradation and imposition of a socially and environmentally unsustainable project. He acknowledged the powers of the Provincial government and urged Council to stand up and stop, and if not stop, slow down the process.

# 14.2 John Li, 206 Brookside Road, regarding the Richmond Hill Centre Secondary Plan (Official Plan Amendment 41) and Proposed By-law 55-23 - (refer to Items 15.1.8 and 18.5)

John Li, 206 Brookside Road, shared his view that the Richmond Hill Centre Secondary Plan had many flaws and that the number of schools forecasted was inadequate for the projected population of the project. He advised that Richmond Hill would be among the top 10 most densely populated communities on earth, questioned whether the development was a livable environment, and requested that residents be given the appropriate opportunity to examine and comment on the complicated plan that would impact Richmond Hill and all of York Region.

# 14.3 Alex Wong, 35 Leno Mills Avenue, regarding the Richmond Hill Centre Secondary Plan (Official Plan Amendment 41) and Proposed By-law 55-23 - (refer to Items 15.1.8 and 18.5)

Alex Wong, 35 Leno Mills Avenue, advised that in his opinion the Richmond Hill Centre proposed population density would be detrimental to any place on earth, including Richmond Hill. He advised that according to experts, the subway extension to Richmond Hill Centre would not significantly alleviate existing traffic concerns. He commented on his experience as a bus driver in the Richmond Hill and Markham area, noting that traffic concerns existed before the pandemic and shared his belief that the proposed density would lead to increased traffic congestion, poor driver behavior, and safety issues. He urged Council to reject the Richmond Hill Centre Secondary Plan final draft and redraft a plan that could eliminate all the negative aspects of the proposed unethical densities.
