### - Presentation by Natasha McLarty, Legislative and Special Projects Officer

### 6.2 Review of Richmond Hill's Draft 2023 - 2027 Multi-Year Accessibility Plan

### - Presentation by Brian Inglis, Legislative and Special Projects Officer

Brian Inglis, Legislative and Special Projects Officer, provided background information on the Multi-year Accessibility Plan (MYAP), including how the Plan was developed and its three interconnected and adaptable strategic principles. He reviewed the Plan's seven key initiatives, provided examples of actions undertaken by the City toward those initiatives, and concluded by outlining next steps.

There were inquiries from members of the Committee on what was meant by 'exceeding accessibility standards' in the design of public spaces; why accessible housing was not included in the MYAP; and how staff engage with the community with respect to the Plan. Members of Committee shared their ideas for consideration to adding to the priorities of the Plan which included, advocating for accessible housing, enhancing accessibility within the community, improving engagement with the public, and promoting the actions of the City with respect to accessibility.

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Comments were made regarding the challenges of finding employment for persons with a disability. It was noted that ways to promote more opportunities for job seekers would be an item for discussion at a future meeting. In addition, staff advised that a representative from Design and Construction will be in attendance at a future meeting to present and address questions regarding accessibility in the design of public spaces.
