1. Call to Order

The Chair called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

2. Council Announcements

Councillor Cilevitz announced that the Federal Government was testing Ontario's Alert Ready system today at 12:55 p.m. which would include sound alerts on cell phones, televisions, and radios.

Mayor West advised that he placed a Moose Hide Campaign information card at each Committee members' desk. He provided details about the campaign's nationwide reach, highlighting the commitment of both Indigenous and non-Indigenous Canadians dedicated to combatting gender-based violence. He noted the significance of the moose hide pin as a cornerstone symbol and the importance of wearing it to support the cause.

Mayor West shared his excitement with a newsletter sent to Richmond Hill households this week that contained community events and updates, and extended appreciation to Communications staff for their great work.

Regional and Local Councillor DiPaola advised of his successful Senior Safety Seminar held at Rouge Woods Community Centre. He extended appreciation to York Region Police Officers that attended and helped educate seniors about fraudulent schemes, crime prevention tips and available resources.

Regional and Local Councillor Chan advised that today was observed as Buddah Day.

Regional and Local Councillor Chan advised that the month of May was observed as Asian Heritage Month, and noted this year's theme "Preserving the Past, Embracing the Future: Amplifying Asian Canadian Legacy". He advised of his participation at events held last weekend and noted that activities continue to be held throughout the Greater Toronto Area and Canada.

Regional and Local Councillor Chan advised of Richmond Hill's 2024 Spring Fair being held on Saturday, May 25th between 12 p.m.to 3 p.m. at Town Park, highlighted the planned activities and entertainment, and extended an invitation for everyone to attend this year's free event.

Councillor Cui advised of the successful Strides for Mackenzie Health community run/walk event held last weekend and extended his appreciation to participants, the community, and sponsors for their generous contributions in support of the cause.

Councillor Cui shared that an upcoming bike riding fundraising event would be held in the coming months and extended an invitation for residents to participate.

Councillor Cui advised of the successful Open Doors Richmond Hill event held last weekend, noted his participation in the Business Improvement Area, the educational opportunities regarding the City's heritage, and encouraged everyone to join next year's event.

Councillor Davidson advised of the successful Oak Ridges Lions Club Community Clean Up event held on Saturday, and implored dog walkers to help by taking their poop and scoop bags home for disposal.

12.1 Member Motion - Councillor Cilevitz - Raising the Pride Flag for the Month of June

Moved by: Councillor Cilevitz

Whereas, we in Canada uphold our Charter of Rights and Freedoms, acknowledging the inherent rights and freedoms of all Canadian citizens;

Whereas, the month of June has been proclaimed Pride Month across Canada, including York Region, for at least the past 25 years;

Whereas, York Region is home to over 1.2 million people with an estimated 120,000 2SLGBTQ+ identifying residents;

Whereas, Richmond Hill proudly upholds its Council-approved Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Policy;

Whereas, Pride Month is not only a time of vibrant celebration but also a crucial opportunity to raise awareness of 2SLGBTQ+ issues;

Whereas, since 2021, hate-motivated incidents directed towards Canada's 2SLGBTQ+ population have increased by 64% (Statistics, Canada 2021);

Whereas, York Region municipalities have made significant strides in supporting York Pride events and initiatives, including the annual Pride Parade held every June in Newmarket;

Whereas, the City of Richmond Hill has immense potential to demonstrate its commitment to 2SLGBTQ+ education and support across the region; and

Whereas, by raising the Pride Flag at Richmond Hill's Community Flagpoles located outside City Hall for the duration of the month of June, Richmond Hill exhibits its strong message of support and inclusion to all identifying 2SLGBTQ+ people and their allies; and

Whereas, the Council approved Community Flag Raisings and Flag Protocol Policy currently only permits flags to be flown on a Community Flagpole for up to one week.

Therefore Be It Resolved:

That, notwithstanding the Community Flag Raisings and Flag Protocol Policy, the Pride Flag be flown on one of City's Community Flagpoles for the duration of the month of June, when otherwise not in use for another community flag raising.
