### 1. Call to Order

The Mayor called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

### 2. Land Acknowledgement

We are gathering on lands that have been home to First Nations Peoples from time immemorial. We acknowledge that what we now call Richmond Hill is on the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the Mississauga and Chippewa Nations of the Williams Treaty. We also recognize that we are on part of the traditional territories of the Haudenosaunee and the Huron Wendat.

We would also like to acknowledge all First Nation, Inuit and Métis peoples from across North America, also known as Turtle Island, who now reside in the City of Richmond Hill. We are committed to rebuilding constructive and cooperative relationships.

## 4.1 Us Maksym, 29 Naughton Drive, regarding Development Charges for the property located at 29 Naughton Drive

Us Maksym, 29 Naughton Drive, addressed Council regarding Development Charges for the property located at 29 Naughton Drive. He provided details on the purchase of the property, reviewed the issuance of the Demolition Permit, explained that the authorization for the demolition permit was inadequately completed, and noted the timeline to obtain a building permit for the subject lands.

### 4.2 Aram Rajabpour, 49 Carrington Drive, regarding a Request for Cordave Parkette Community Garden Pilot Project

Aram Rajabpour, 49 Carrington Drive, addressed Council regarding a request for Cordave Parkette Community Garden Pilot Project and shared his views on the benefits it would have on the community.

### 5. Council Announcements

Councillor Davidson advised of the in-person public information session held yesterday at the Oak Ridges Community Centre regarding increasing the housing supply in the City. She encouraged residents to attend upcoming open houses on June 10<sup>th</sup> (virtual), and June 13<sup>th</sup> (in-person) at Elgin Barrow Arena to hear from experts and staff on how gentle density can help to increase the housing supply in the City.

Councillor Cilevitz advised that June was observed as Pride Month in the world and the City and extended warm remarks and best wishes to everyone celebrating. She advised of the raising of the Pride flag at the municipal offices and extended an invitation to the community to attend the York Pride Parade on June 15<sup>th</sup> at 3 p.m. in Newmarket. She highlighted that the family-friendly event would feature fun-filled activities for all to enjoy, and noted the participation of Richmond Hill's firetrucks in the parade.

Councillor Cilevitz advised of the virtual Ward 5 Civic Engagement Committee meeting being held on June 13<sup>th</sup> from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m., noting the topic of discussion was civic engagement in the climate crisis, with guest speaker Esther Collier representing Climate Action Richmond Hill. She indicated that those interested in joining the virtual meeting can contact her office to register.

Councillor Cui announced that June was Bike Month in York Region. He participated in a bike safety event alongside York Region Deputy Police Chief

and emphasized the importance of driver awareness and maintaining a safe distance from cyclists.

Councillor Cui advised that June was observed as Seniors Month. He extended his gratitude to all seniors for their contributions and wished them well and good health.

Councillor Cui announced the launch of the Ward 4 Neighbourhood Watch program, noted this years' goal to promoting the program in the Mill Pond community, and highlighted last years' success in the Westbook and Jefferson communities.

Regional and Local Councillor DiPaola announced that he was hosting a community barbeque at the Mill Pond on June 15<sup>th</sup>. He advised that so far 2,300 participants had registered to attend, extended an invitation to all residents to attend to enjoy the many planned events and suggested to register in advance to assist with event planning.

Regional and Local Councillor Chan echoed remarks regarding the month of June being observed as Seniors' Month and announced that a complimentary barbeque for all seniors in Richmond Hill was being held at Mill Pond Park on Friday from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Regional and Local Councillor Chan advised that as part of Seniors' Month, on June 20<sup>th</sup> between 7 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. a representative from Carefirst Seniors and Community Services and a York Regional Police Senior Safety Officer would be sharing information and tips on senior care and safety. He extended an invitation to seniors and older adults who wished to attend to contact his office for registration to ensure accommodation for all interested individuals.

Councillor Liu announced that he was hosting a free barbeque on Friday from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at Richmond Green Park and extended an invitation to the community to attend the fun filled event.

Mayor West echoed remarks regarding Pride Month, advised of the raising of the Pride flag at the municipal offices, highlighted various Pride events held and attended recently, noted the big Pride Parade being held in Newmarket on June 15<sup>th</sup> and encouraged everyone to join the family-friendly event.

WHEREAS the City has a tradition of protecting its natural environment and working with residents, partners, and other levels of governments to build a more resilient and sustainable community;

WHEREAS the City is committed to pursuing greater environmental sustainability and climate resilience through the goals, targets, and actions in its Environment Strategy, Community Energy and Emissions Plan, Climate Change Framework, and related plans and policies;

WHEREAS the concept of sustainability – encompassing three interconnected "pillars" supportive of social, environmental, and economic sustainability – is increasingly informing the City's core documents, such as the Strategic Plan and Official Plan, and its approach to land use planning;

WHEREAS Richmond Hill supports the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which aim to improve social outcomes across the globe by holistically addressing issues of inequality and environmental degradation, and finds alignment with applicable "urban SDGs" – notably #11 Sustainable Cities and Communities;

WHEREAS the Urban Economy Forum (UEF) (an international organization that engages with the United Nations (UN) to lead global dialogue on sustainable urban resources), in partnership with UN-Habitat and the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, launched the Toronto-based World Urban Pavilion (Pavilion) in 2020 as a knowledge-exchange hub to share best practices, innovation and research in urban development and revitalization from countries around the world;

WHEREAS UEF has invited the City of Richmond Hill to participate in the Pavilion's flagship program, Canada: Frontrunner of Urban SDGs, which aims to build on existing initiatives and work with cities to identify, design and implement pilot projects to address significant urban challenges and share lessons learned from around the world; and WHEREAS Richmond Hill's participation entails identification of existing projects, programs and initiatives that can be showcased as exemplary urban SDG achievements, and identification of planned projects that can be pursued with World Urban Pavilion support for future showcasing.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved That:

a) The Council of the City of Richmond Hill agrees to collaborate with the Urban Economy Forum and World Urban Pavilion as a participant in the Canada: Frontrunner of Urban SDGs program, by signing an agreed upon Letter of Intent;

b) Staff be directed to work with the Urban Economy Forum and World Urban Pavilion to create and promote an Urban Transformation Profile for Richmond Hill as part of the Frontrunner City Program;

c) Staff be further directed to further explore the nature of this collaboration as a Canada: Frontrunner of Urban SDGs, with consideration of existing staff capacity and resources, in order to define the terms of participation in a jointly developed Memorandum of Understanding with the Urban Economy Forum and World Urban Pavilion; and,

d) A copy of this resolution be circulated to the Urban Economy Forum, World Urban Pavilion, UN University (Richmond Hill), and Richmond Hill's Members of Parliament.
