The expansion to 300 residential units and the significant increase in building height would have a substantial impact on the area's overall feel. The limited allocation of only 18 visitor parking spots raises concerns about increased traffic and the potential for parking congestion on surrounding streets.

Additionally, making Hall Street the sole point of access for residents and visitors poses a safety risk, especially for pedestrians. Although I support efforts to address the region's housing shortage, I believe this particular development does not serve our community's best interests and may open the door to future projects that further compromise the distinct identity of Richmond Hill.
