York Region Environmental Alliance (YREA) commends efforts to move forward with expanding local food opportunities and establishing urban agriculture in Richmond Hill. However, it is important that 'organic' agriculture be added as a requisite requirement for these initiatives. excellent partner with their experience in <u>CSA urban agriculture</u>. YREA encourages the development of these initiatives in an expedited manner so that local food needs can be addressed to support the increase of our population and recent surge of development.
