Whereas democracy is healthy when everyone is able to participate fully and safely and contribute to the well-being of their community; and

Whereas we are witnessing the dissolution of democratic discourse and respectful debate across all levels of government and in neighbouring jurisdictions; and

Whereas Ontario's municipally elected officials are dealing with increasingly hostile, unsafe work environments facing threats and harassment; and

Whereas municipally elected officials, as representatives of their communities, have the right to conduct their democratic duties in an environment of respect and civility, and members of the public share a responsibility to uphold these standards; and

Whereas social media platforms have exacerbated disrespectful dialogue, negative commentary, and toxic engagement which disincentivizes individuals, especially women and candidates from diverse backgrounds from running for office; and

Whereas better decisions are made when democracy is respectful and constructive and the voices of diverse genders, identities, ethnicities, races, sexual orientation, ages and abilities are heard and represented around municipal council tables; and

Whereas the Association of Municipalities of Ontario's Healthy Democracy Project has identified concerning trends with fewer people voting in local elections and running for municipal office; and

Whereas in 2024, female elected representatives from across Halton formed a group called H.E.R. (Halton Elected Representatives) which pledged to speak out against harassment and negativity in politics and call on elected officials to uphold the highest standards of conduct; and

Whereas H.E.R. Halton has launched a campaign called *Elect Respect* to promote the importance of healthy democracy and safe, inclusive, respectful work environments for all elected officials that encourages individuals to participate in the political process; and

Now Therefore Be It Resolved:

1. That the Council of the City of Richmond Hill supports the *Elect Respect* pledge and commits to:

- a) Treat each other, and others, with respect in all spaces, public, private, and online;
- b) Reject and call out harassment, abuse, and personal attacks;
- c) Focus debate on ideas and policies, not personal attacks;
- d) Help build a supportive culture where people of all backgrounds feel safe to run for and hold office;
- e) Call on relevant authorities to ensure the protection of elected officials who face abuse or threats;
- f) Model integrity and respect by holding one another to the highest standards of conduct.

2. That the Council of the City of Richmond Hill calls on elected officials, organizations and community members to support the *Elect Respect* campaign and sign the online pledge at electrespect.ca.

16.1 Member Motion - Councillor Shiu - Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO) Second Long-Term Request for Proposals (LT2) Municipal Support Confirmation - 25 Mural Street, Richmond Hill

Whereas, the Independent Electricity System Operator's (IESO) Second Long-Term Request for Proposals (LT2 RFP) window will be the largest

competitive electricity procurement to increase the Province's electrical supply to meet identified needs emerging from 2029–2034;

Whereas, the LT2 RFP will consider eligible energy projects from resources such as wind, solar, bioenergy, energy storage, combined heat and power facilities, hydroelectric, and natural gas, that are 1 megawatt (MW) or greater, and capable of achieving commercial operation by May 1, 2030 (20-year contract term);

Whereas, the LT2 RFP process requires Municipal Support Confirmation (MSC) to confirm that the Proponent has undertaken or is committed to undertake engagement activities to the satisfaction of the City of Richmond Hill and that the City of Richmond Hill supports the submission of the Proposal;

Whereas, the Council approved Community Energy and Emissions Plan (2021) identifies actions to support the goal of achieving net-zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2050, including the increase in solar power;

Whereas, the City of Richmond Hill has received a request for a MSC as part of the IESO's LT2 RFP from Moose Power Inc., on behalf of Dream Industrial REIT, for a proposed 2 MW rooftop solar project at an existing industrial building located at 25 Mural Street (Municipal Project Lands);

Whereas, the proposal and location of the Municipal Project Lands in Ward 6, south of 16th Avenue and east of Leslie Street and within the Beaver Creek Business Park, minimizes potential impacts on surrounding land uses and the environment; and

Whereas, the proposal to install solar panels on the Municipal Project Lands shall support the community energy needs and reduce GHG emissions.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved:

1. That the City of Richmond Hill supports the submission of a Proposal for the Long-Term Energy Project located on the Municipal Project Lands;
2. That this resolution's sole purpose is to satisfy the mandatory requirements of Section 4.2(c)(iii) of the IESO's LT2(e-1) RFP and may not be used for the purpose of any other form of approval in relation to the Proposal or Long-Term Energy Project or for any other purpose;

3. That the Proponent has committed to undertake, Indigenous and community engagement activities (if needed) in respect of the Long-Term Energy Project to the satisfaction of the Municipality;
4. That the Municipal Project Lands does not include lands designated as Prime Agricultural Areas in the City of Richmond Hill's Official Plan;
5. That the Proponent, if successfully selected as part of the IESO's LT2(e-1) RFP, is required to obtain all necessary municipal approvals and/or applicable permits;
6. That Council hereby adopts the resolution attached to this Member Motion, as Attachment A, titled "Exhibit A – Form of Municipal Resolution in Support of Proposal Submission" (the "Resolution"); and
7. That the Mayor and Clerk be directed to sign the attached Resolution as evidence of municipal support for the proposal on the Municipal Project Lands.
